Balloon-vine

Adventive (native of tropical America)

2. KOELREUTERIA Laxm.

Trees; leaves pinnate-bipinnate, leaflets 7-15, toothed; panicles large; flowers bright yellow.

Golden-raintree

Cultivated (introduced from E Asia)

Tree; leaves pinnate or sometimes partly bipinnate; flowers yellow in broad loose panicles; fruits papery brown pods, persisting in winter.

HIPPOCASTANACEAE, Horse-chestnut Family

1. AESCULUS L. Buckeye, Horse Chestnut

Trees and shrubs with opposite palmately compound leaves; flowers hypogynous, in terminal panicles, bisporangiate and staminate ones usually in same panicle; sepals 5, united, sometimes oblique or gibbous at base; corolla zygomorphic; petals 4 or 5, clawed; extrastaminal disk present; stamens 5-8, separate; carpels 3, united, ovary 3-loculed, 2 ovules in each locule; style and stigma 1; fruit a leathery capsule, seeds 1-3, smooth, brown, large.

- a Leaflets mostly 7; winter buds glutinous; petals usually 5, white, marked with red and yellow; fruits prickly.

1. *Aesculus hippocastanum L.

Horse-chestnut

Cultivated (native of SE Europe and adjacent Asia)

Tree; leaves palmately compound; leaflets mostly 7, obovate, widest above the middle; terminal buds sticky; capsules prickly.

2. Aesculus glabra Willd. var. glabra

Ohio Buckeye

Tree, medium size; leaves palmately compound; leaflets mostly 5, widest at about the middle; terminal bud not sticky; capsules prickly.
